Edwin Savage was not a BHC But wonderful to remember him

A letter to Miss Ida Cohen, dated May 8, 1917

"Lt. Savage and 3 of his men ran into a group of about 3 Huns and they 'went' for them and drove them back to a strong point in their rear - then the Huns realized how small our attacking party was, started sniping at them and our men, carried away with Lt. Savage's courage, carried on with the attack. It was a magnificent piece of brave work but the odds were too great - Lieut. Savage and one of his men were killed and Lance Corporal and the other men fought their way back to our lines. Lieut. Savage was one of the gamest officers and his death is a distinct loss to the battalion. Permit me to express to you my sympathy."
